Executive Director and Board President Year in Review

We continued to see high demand for programs and services for children, youth, and families in 2022. As an example, in 2021 we saw 338 unique youth access services and in 2022 we served 495 unique youth. It was also a stabilizing year for us to get back on track with the pandemic winding down. We didn't shy away from opportunities in 2022 with the development of many new programs and services especially in youth programs.

We continued to focus on the development of our staff team. We ensure staff are supported through professional development, wellness committee activities, and strengthening our culture.

We participated in BGC Canada Learning and Impact Project which focused on surveying children and youth all across Canada to prove and improve on their experience at the Club. Our results demonstrated impressive impact with 96% of our children and youth reporting that because of the Club, they have more people they like to spend time with. As a people and relationship-focused organization, it was great to see that 93% of members report that they are more aware of the feelings of others and 90% report being more confident because of their experience at the Club. These results urge us to do more, serve more, and develop more innovative programs to meet the demands. We know that our work is not done.

For 2023, we are trending higher again for the number of youth we are serving. We have expanded outreach into three additional high schools. We are conducting a feasibility study for an expansion project to develop a new Club on the south shore of Kamloops. We've seen facility improvements in our Williams Lake Club and are striving to serve more children and youth in the Cariboo.




